

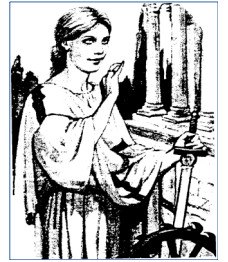

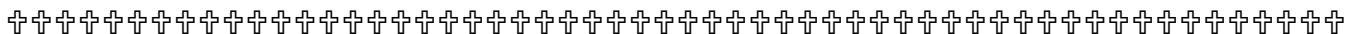
#### Parish Registration

### Scripture Reflection

The central thread in John's understanding of Jesus is that Jesus is the revelation of God's own divine self. Jesus' mission is to reveal the Father. This mission is passed on to each generation of followers. By taking within ourselves the revealed Word-made-flesh in Jesus, we become participants in the divine plan of being "a light to the nations." The suffering servant in Isaiah is fulfilled in Jesus and continued in every Christian. John's line "here is the Lamb of God ..." is likely included because these words had already established themselves as an integral part of worship in the early church.

**Ordinary Time – or is it?**

So, the Christmas Season is over. Now what? It kind of feels like a letdown, right? You have all these powerful celebrations of the liturgical year in Advent and Christmas and Lent and Easter, and then it's just plain old 'Ordinary Time.' Ho-hum. Boring. Or is it?

Ordinary time is a Liturgical season just like these others. It has focus, themes, and celebrates the life of Christ. The season of Ordinary Time, which runs 33 or 34 weeks, is a celebration of the earthly ministry of Jesus and provides us with rich opportunities to get to know the Lord so that we can develop a closer and more personal relationship with him. Ordinary Time introduces us to the Gospels, to the miracles, the parables, the calling of the Disciples, the sermons. In short, we discover Jesus and who he really is! In our society, we often equate the word ordinary with words like 'plain', 'unremarkable' or even 'unimportant'. In the church, however, the term ordinary refers to a season that is ongoing and rhythmical. The holidays and special occasions are a chance to change the pace of the year, but we could not live at that pace all year long, and there is more to the whole picture of Christ's life.

Interestingly, the liturgical color for Ordinary Time is green, the symbol of growth and new life, not only in the life of Jesus, but in our own lives as well. By actively participating in the season of Ordinary Time we are participating in the everyday life of Christ. It is easy to get caught up in everyday things like schedules, work, social media, worrying, and more. What if in Ordinary Time we could get caught up in learning and growing in Christ? What if we could replace everyday things with a growing and developing relationship with our Lord?

Here are a few ideas:

1. Look at your habits and decide to make changes day to day. Learn a new habit, starting with reading each day's Gospel.
2. Practice learning to live with gratitude. Start, or end, your day by thanking God for 5 ordinary things in your life. Maybe do this with your family around the dinner table, listing individual and family gratitude items.
3. Reflect on Jesus' life using your imagination. Imagine Jesus going through his day, doing the everyday things like eating, walking, being with friends and praying. You could use the day's Gospel as a starting point.

Ordinary Time might not seem so ordinary if we take the time to live it!
