As you have heard we entered Stage 2 of the Relaunch Strategy on Friday, June 12, while some restrictions have been lifted the pandemic is still with us and existing health and safety requirements remain in place and must be met.

We now have seating to capacity with physical spacing. The doors will be locked just before mass starts, so come early to sign in. We will continue to practice physical distancing, wearing a mask, and using hand-sanitizer on entering and exiting the church building.

Open masses still depend on volunteers so if you are able to be a Sign In Volunteer or an Usher, please contact Shelley Lohues to sign up for a time that works for you. Note: those who are 65 years and older cannot volunteer as they are regarded as Highly Vulnerable.

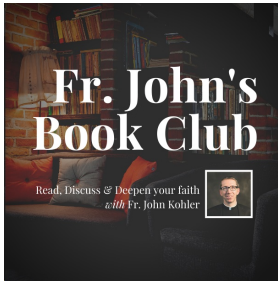

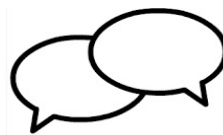
